A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – Shelter and Weather Protection Requirement – Bison**
3 **Exemption**

4 FOR the purpose of providing that the prohibition against unnecessarily failing to
5 provide an animal with shelter or protection from the weather does not apply to
6 a person who has charge or custody of bison, as owner or otherwise; and
7 generally relating to the abuse or neglect of animals.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Criminal Law**

16 10–604.

17 (a) **[A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, A**
18 person may not:

- 19 (1) overdrive or overload an animal;
- 20 (2) deprive an animal of necessary sustenance;
- 21 (3) inflict unnecessary suffering or pain on an animal;

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (4) cause, procure, or authorize an act prohibited under item (1), (2), or
2 (3) of this subsection; or

3 (5) if the person has charge or custody of an animal, as owner or
4 otherwise, unnecessarily fail to provide the animal with nutritious food in sufficient
5 quantity, necessary veterinary care, proper drink, air, space, shelter, or protection
6 from the weather.

7 **(B) THE PROHIBITION IN SUBSECTION (A)(5) OF THIS SECTION AGAINST**
8 **UNNECESSARILY FAILING TO PROVIDE AN ANIMAL WITH SHELTER OR**
9 **PROTECTION FROM THE WEATHER DOES NOT APPLY TO A PERSON WHO HAS**
10 **CHARGE OR CUSTODY OF BISON, AS OWNER OR OTHERWISE.**

11 **[(b)] (C)** (1) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor
12 and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 90 days or a fine not
13 exceeding \$1,000 or both.

14 (2) As a condition of sentencing, the court may order a defendant
15 convicted of violating this section to participate in and pay for psychological
16 counseling.

17 (3) As a condition of probation, the court may prohibit a defendant
18 from owning, possessing, or residing with an animal.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
20 October 1, 2012.
