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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Carroll County – Huckster, Hawker, or Peddler License – Repeal**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law that relate to licenses issued to  
4 hucksters, hawkers, or peddlers selling fruits or vegetables in Carroll County.

5 BY repealing

6 The Public Local Laws of Carroll County

7 Section 6–101

8 Article 7 – Public Local Laws of Maryland

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
11 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12 **Article 7 – Carroll County**

13 **[6–101.**

14 (a) No huckster, hawker or peddler shall sell or offer for sale any fruits or  
15 vegetables in Carroll County until the huckster, hawker or peddler shall have first taken  
16 out a license for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of this section; provided,  
17 however, that this section shall not apply to the farmers or growers selling their own fruits  
18 or vegetables.

1 (b) For every such license, the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Carroll County shall  
 2 be paid fifteen dollars per annum. The receipts from the licenses shall be paid to the County  
 3 Treasurer for the use of the county. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall,  
 4 upon conviction, be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred  
 5 dollars, to be recovered as other fines are recovered.]

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
 7 October 1, 2017.
