## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning 2 Criminal Law - Animal Cruelty - Payment of Costs 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a court to order a defendant convicted of a certain charge of animal cruelty, as a condition of sentencing, to pay, in addition to any 4 5 other fines and costs, all reasonable costs incurred in removing, housing, 6 treating, or euthanizing an animal confiscated from the defendant; and 7 generally relating to animal cruelty. 8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 9 Article - Criminal Law 10 Section 10-604, 10-606, 10-607, and 10-608 Annotated Code of Maryland 11 (2012 Replacement Volume and 2013 Supplement) 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 14 MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 15 Article - Criminal Law 10-604. 16 17 (a) A person may not: overdrive or overload an animal; 18 (1) 19 (2) deprive an animal of necessary sustenance; 20 (3) inflict unnecessary suffering or pain on an animal; 21cause, procure, or authorize an act prohibited under item (1), (2), or 22 (3) of this subsection; or
