4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Comptroller to issue a certain number of  
5 Class 6 pub-brewery licenses and Class 7 micro-brewery licenses to certain  
6 ~~persons~~ applicants for locations in an enterprise zone in Dorchester County;  
7 ~~expanding the location for Class 7 micro-brewery licenses in Wicomico County~~  
8 ~~to include any enterprise zone in Wicomico County; repealing a certain~~  
9 ~~restriction concerning micro-brewery licenses~~ specifying that certain provisions  
10 of this Act do not limit the number of certain licenses that may be issued in  
11 Dorchester County; making a certain technical corrections correction; and

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 (ii) ~~Subject to subparagraphs (iii) and (iv) of this paragraph, the~~  
 16 ~~Board of License Commissioners~~ **STATE COMPTROLLER** ~~may issue one Class 6~~  
 17 ~~pub-brewery license or one Class 7 micro-brewery license, but not both, to a person~~  
 18 ~~that holds not more than three Class B beer, wine and liquor licenses.~~

19 (iii) ~~A Class 6 pub-brewery license or a Class 7 micro-brewery~~

3 **THAT THE STATE COMPTROLLER MAY ISSUE IN DORCHESTER COUNTY.**

4           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
5 July 1, 2010.
