- 17 (ii) whether a partial or full replacement of the athletic and physical education facilities is needed;
- 19 (iii) the estimated cost of a partial or full replacement of the athletic 20 and physical education facilities; and
- 21 (iv) the overall quality of the athletic and physical education 22 facilities;
- 23 (2) the average cost for public high school athletic and physical education 24 facility replacements;
- 25 (3) the total financial need by county for athletic and physical education 26 facility replacements;
- 27 (4) recommendations on best practices for replacing athletic and physical education facilities: and
- 29 (5) an audit of any related needs assessments that have already been 30 conducted by a county or county board.
- 31 (c) A county board shall provide the information required under subsection (b)(1) 32 of this section on request from the Interagency Commission on School Construction.

1 2 3	(d) On or before December 1, 2024, the Interagency Commission on School Construction shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 1, 2024, the Prince George's County Board of Education and the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission shall meet to discuss potential partnerships to upgrade public high school athletic and physical education facilities in Prince George's County.
8 9 10 11	SECTION 4. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2024. Section 2 of this Act It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2025, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
