BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Human Services Section 3–602 Annotated Code of Maryland (2019 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Human Services 3-602.[At least once every 3 years, the] **THE** Office of the Inspector General in the Department shall:
