BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – State Personnel and Pensions Section 22–406(c)(4)(v) and (vi) and 23–407(c)(4)(iv) and (v) Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Personnel and Pensions Section 22–406(c)(5), (6), (7), and (10) and 23–407(c)(5), (6), (7), and (10) Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
