Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services 4 in Maryland; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task 5 Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain 6 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 7 requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain 8 matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to 9 the Governor, the Health Services Cost Review Commission, the President of 10 the Senate, the Speaker of the House, and certain committees of the General 11 Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; 12 and generally relating to the Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland. 13
- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That:
 - (a) There is a Task Force to Study Access to Pharmacy Services in Maryland.

It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
