## A BILL ENTITLED

FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on Prohibiting Debris From Entering 4 5 Storm Drains or Stormwater Inlets; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing 6 of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain 7 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the 8 Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; 9 requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; making this Act an emergency measure; 10 11 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force on 12 Prohibiting Debris From Entering Storm Drains or Stormwater Inlets.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 14 That:
- 15 (a) There is a Task Force on Prohibiting Debris From Entering Storm Drains or 16 Stormwater Inlets.
- 17 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 18 (1) one representative of the Department of the Environment, designated 19 by the Secretary of the Environment;
- 20 (2) one representative of the Department of Natural Resources, designated 21 by the Secretary of Natural Resources;
- 22 (3) one representative of the State Highway Administration, designated by 23 the Administrator of the Administration; and
- 24 (4) one representative from each of the following organizations:

measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to

- 1 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
- 2 enacted. It shall remain effective through November 1, 2019, and, at the end of November
- 3 1, 2019, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be
- 4 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
