1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Carroll County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class BC Beer, Wine, and Liquor License**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the requirement that a Class BC beer, wine, and liquor license
4 holder provide food for consumption at certain catered events in Carroll County; and
5 generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Carroll County.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

19 16–102.

1 This title applies only in Carroll County.

2 16-903.

3 (a) There is a Class BC beer, wine, and liquor license.

4 (b) The Board may issue a Class BC license to an applicant that has:

5 (1) a hotel or restaurant that meets the licensing requirements in §
6 16-902(c) of this subtitle; or

7 (2) a Class B hotel or restaurant (on- and off-sale) beer, wine, and liquor
8 license, if the applicant surrenders the Class B license to the Board before being issued the
9 Class BC license.

10 (c) (1) The license authorizes the license holder to sell:

11 (i) beer, wine, and liquor 7 days a week at a restaurant or hotel for
12 on-premises consumption;

13 (ii) beer 7 days a week at a restaurant or hotel for
14 off-premises consumption; and

15 (iii) beer, wine, and liquor 7 days a week at a catered event held off
16 the restaurant or hotel premises for consumption on the premises of the event.

17 (2) **[The] EITHER THE** license holder **OR THE EVENT SPONSOR** shall
18 provide food for consumption at the catered event.

19 (d) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and on the
20 days as set out for a Class B license under § 16-2005 of this title.

21 (e) The annual license fee is \$250 greater than the fee for a Class B hotel or
22 restaurant (on- and off-sale) beer, wine, and liquor license.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
24 1, 2019.
