17	(a) (1) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.							
18 19 20 21 22	(2) "Board of Education District" means a geographic area of Montgomery County in which an elected member of the Montgomery County Board of Education must be a legal resident. The geographic area of each district is described in subsection (f) of this section. Each district shall be substantially equal in population, and the districts shall be reapportioned on the basis of each decennial census of the United States.							
23	(3) "Elected member" means 1 of the 7 elected and voting members of the

- 2Montgomery County Board or a member appointed to fill a vacancy of 1 of these 7 members. 1 2 The Montgomery County Board consists of: (b) 3 5 elected members, each of whom resides in a different board of (1) education district; 4 2 elected members who may reside anywhere in the county; and 5 (2)6 1 student member. (3)An elected member of the county board shall be a registered voter of 7 8 Montgomery County. 9 (d) Members of the Montgomery County Board shall be elected at the general 10 election every 2 years as required by subsection (f) of this section. 11 (e) The student member shall be a bona fide resident of Montgomery 12 County and a regularly enrolled junior or senior year student from a Montgomery County 13 public high school. 14 The nomination and election process shall be as agreed on by the county board and the Montgomery County region of the Maryland Association of Student Councils. 15 16 This agreement shall include a process by which to replace one or both of the final 17 candidates if they are unable to proceed in the election. Any student enrolled in a middle 18 or high school in the Montgomery County public schools may: Nominate a student member candidate; 19 (i) 20 Vote for delegates from the student's school, who in turn vote in (ii) 21a nominating convention to reduce to 2 the number of candidates for student member if 22there are 3 or more candidates; and 23Vote directly for 1 of the 2 remaining student member (iii) candidates. 24 25The candidate receiving the second highest number of votes in the 26 direct election shall become the alternate student member. The alternate shall serve if the 27 student member is unable to complete his elected term. 28 Except as provided in paragraphs (5), (6), and (7) of this subsection, the
- 30 (5)Unless invited to attend by the affirmative vote of a majority of the 31 county board, the student member may not attend an executive session that relates to 32 hearings held under § 6–202(a) of this article.

student member has the same rights and privileges of an elected member.

- 1 (6) As provided in paragraph (7) of this subsection, the student member 2 shall vote on all matters except those relating to § 6–202(a) of this article.
- 3 (7) On a majority vote of the elected members, the county board may determine, on a case by case basis, whether a matter under consideration is covered by the exclusionary provision in paragraph (6) of this subsection.
- 6 (f) (1) Each elected member serves for a term of 4 years beginning on 7 December 1 after the member's election and until a successor is elected and qualifies. The 8 terms of elected members are staggered as required by the terms of the members serving 9 on the county board as of July 1, 1978 so that 4 members are elected in gubernatorial election years and 3 members are elected in presidential election years.
- 11 (2) Elected members of the county board shall be elected by the voters of 12 the entire county.
- 13 (3) (i) Of the 3 members elected in 1992 and every 4 years thereafter, 1 14 shall reside in Board of Education District 2 and 1 shall reside in Board of Education 15 District 4. The third member may reside in any part of the county.
- 16 (ii) Of the 4 members elected in 1990 and every 4 years thereafter, 1 17 shall reside in Board of Education District 1, 1 shall reside in Board of Education District 18 3, and 1 shall reside in Board of Education District 5. The fourth member may reside in 19 any part of the county.
- 20 (iii) The descriptions of board of education districts in this subsection 21 refer to the geographical boundaries of the election districts and the precincts:
- 1. As reviewed and certified by the Montgomery County Board of Elections or its designees, before the precinct boundaries were reported to the U.S. Bureau of the Census as part of the [2010] **2020** Census Redistricting Data Program; and
- 25 2. As those precinct lines are specifically shown on the P.L. 94–171 census block maps provided by the U.S. Bureau of the Census and as reviewed and corrected by the Division of [Long-range] CAPITAL Planning AND REAL ESTATE of the Montgomery County Public Schools.
- [(iv)] Where precincts are split between Board of Education Districts, census tract and block numbers, as indicated in the P.L. 94–171 data or shown on the P.L. 171 census block maps provided by the U.S. Bureau of the Census and referred to in this subtitle, are used to define the boundaries of the education districts.



SENATE BILL 3

1	(iv) Willful neglect of duty.
2 3 4	(2) Before removing a member, the County Council shall provide the member a copy of the charges against him and give him an opportunity within 10 days to request a hearing.
5	(3) If the member requests a hearing within the 10-day period:
6 7 8	(i) The County Council promptly shall hold a hearing, but a hearing may not be set within 10 days after the County Council sends the member a notice of the hearing; and
9 10	(ii) The member shall have an opportunity to be heard publicly before the County Council in the member's own defense, in person or by counsel.
11 12	(4) A member removed under this subsection has the right to a de novo review of the removal by the Circuit Court for Montgomery County.
13 14 15 16	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
