(2) A HOLDER OF A CLASS BLX LICENSE ISSUED FOR A MOVIE THEATER MAY SELL BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION FROM NOON TO 12:30 A.M. THE FOLLOWING DAY.
