- 2 THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN
- 3 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE
- 4 FOLLOWING INFORMATION FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR:
- 5 (I) THE NUMBER OF GRANTS AWARDED UNDER THE BRIDGE
- 6 PROGRAM;
- 7 (II) THE AMOUNT OF EACH GRANT AWARDED UNDER THIS
- 8 SUBTITLE; AND
- 9 (III) THE NAME AND LOCATION OF EACH ORGANIZATION
- 10 AWARDED A GRANT UNDER THE BRIDGE PROGRAM.

- 12 (A) THERE IS A BUSINESS RESOURCE INITIATIVE FOR DEVELOPMENTAL
- 13 GROWTH AND EMPOWERMENT FUND.
- 14 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO FUND GRANTS AWARDED UNDER THE

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 years and, at the end of June 30, 2032, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
