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Insurance - Surplus Lines - Short-Term Medical Insurance

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the scope of certain provisions of law governing surplus lines 4 insurance to authorize the use of surplus lines insurance for certain short-term 5 medical insurance coverage; authorizing the procurement of short-term medical 6 insurance from a nonadmitted insurer under certain circumstances; specifying the 7 conditions under which short-term medical insurance may be procured from a 8 nonadmitted insurer; prohibiting the inclusion of certain provisions in a short-term 9 medical insurance policy procured from a nonadmitted insurer; requiring the 10 Maryland Insurance Commissioner to develop and make available on the Web site of the Maryland Insurance Administration a certain consumer guide; requiring a 11 12 certain affidavit to include certain information; altering a certain requirement for an applicant for a certain certificate of qualification; providing for the application of this 13 14 Act; and generally relating to surplus lines insurance and short-term medical 15 insurance.
