A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Garrett County – Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2021**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain requirements that the Board of License
4 Commissioners for Garrett County charge a one-time issuing fee for certain licenses;
5 altering the types of alcoholic beverages that a license holder may purchase from a
6 wholesaler or a retailer in Garrett County; making a conforming change; and
7 generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Garrett County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

21 4–1204.

22 (a) A Class C per diem beer, wine, and liquor license entitles the license holder to
23 exercise any of the privileges conferred by this class of license:

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (1) for the use of a person holding an entertainment event that is conducted
2 by a club;

3 (2) at the place described in the license; and

4 (3) for a period not exceeding 7 consecutive days.

5 (b) Alcoholic beverages sold under a Class C per diem beer, wine, and liquor
6 license shall be purchased by the license holder from a retail dealer.

7 21-102.

8 This title applies only in Garrett County.

9 21-904.

10 (b) There is a Class C (club and organization) beer, wine, and liquor license.

11 (g) **[(1)]** The annual license fees are:

12 **[(i)] (1)** \$1,500 for a 6-day license; and

13 **[(ii)] (2)** \$1,750 for a 7-day license.

14 **[(2)** The Board shall charge a one-time issuing fee for a new license in an
15 amount equal to the annual license fee.]

16 21-1001.

17 (a) There is an art establishment license.

18 (g) The annual license fee is \$205 [in addition to a one-time issuing fee for a new
19 license of \$205].

20 21-1301.

21 (a) The following sections of Title 4, Subtitle 12 ("Temporary Licenses") of
22 Division I of this article apply in the county without exception or variation:

23 (1) § 4-1202 ("Per diem licenses");

24 (2) § 4-1206 ("License to dispose of stock");

25 (3) § 4-1207 ("Temporary move of licensed premises");

26 (4) § 4-1208 ("Hours and days of sale"); and

1 (5) § 4–1209 (“Wine permit for fund–raising event”).

2 (b) The following sections of Title 4, Subtitle 12 (“Temporary Licenses”) of
3 Division I of this article do not apply in the county and are superseded by §§ 21–1309 [and],
4 21–1310, **AND 21–1312** of this subtitle:

5 (1) § 4–1203 (“Class C per diem beer and Class C per diem beer and wine
6 licenses”);

7 (2) § 4–1204 (“Class C per diem beer, wine, and liquor license”); and

8 (3) § 4–1205 (“License fees”).

9 21–1312.

10 A holder of a Class C per diem beer, wine, and liquor license may purchase [beer and
11 wine] **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES** from a wholesaler or [beer, wine, and liquor from] a
12 retailer.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
14 1, 2021.
