A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Lawyers – Bar Admission Requirement – Exception for Rent Escrow**
3 **Proceedings**

4 FOR the purpose of providing an exception to certain requirements to practice law in
5 the State for a person representing a landlord in a rent escrow proceeding in the
6 District Court of Maryland and for a person representing a tenant in a rent
7 escrow proceeding in the District Court of Maryland under certain
8 circumstances; and generally relating to exceptions to the requirements to
9 practice law in the State.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article – Business Occupations and Professions**

23 10–206.

24 (a) Except as otherwise provided by law, before an individual may practice
25 law in the State, the individual shall:

1 (1) be admitted to the Bar; and

2 (2) meet any requirement that the Court of Appeals may set by rule.

3 (b) This section does not apply to:

4 (1) a person while representing a landlord in a summary ejectment **OR**
5 **A RENT ESCROW** proceeding in the District Court of Maryland;

6 (2) a person while representing a tenant in a summary ejectment **OR A**
7 **RENT ESCROW** proceeding in the District Court of Maryland if the person is:

8 (i) a law student practicing in a clinical law program at a law
9 school accredited by the American Bar Association with the in-court supervision of a
10 faculty member; or

11 (ii) employed by a nonprofit organization receiving grants from
12 the Maryland Legal Services Corporation and:

13 1. the person has training and experience;

14 2. the person is supervised by a lawyer; and

15 3. the supervising lawyer's appearance is entered in the
16 proceeding;

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
18 October 1, 2011.
