CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City – Office of the Baltimore City Sheriff – Positions**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Baltimore City Sheriff to establish a pay scale for
4 certain employees under certain circumstances; ~~requiring~~ authorizing the Sheriff of
5 Baltimore City to appoint an information technology specialist to a certain rank to
6 assess and manage the technology needs of the Sheriff's Office; ~~requiring~~ authorizing
7 the Sheriff of Baltimore City to appoint a chief financial officer to a certain rank to
8 manage the budget, grants, and revenue of the Sheriff's Office; ~~requiring~~ authorizing
9 the Sheriff of Baltimore City to appoint a deputy sheriff to a certain rank and grant
10 a certain salary increase under certain circumstances; ~~increasing the~~ authorizing,
11 under certain circumstances, a certain additional deputy sheriff expense allowance
12 ~~from \$400 to \$600~~; and generally relating to the Office of the Baltimore City Sheriff.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

4 2–309.

5 (a) The sheriff of a county and his deputies shall receive the annual salaries
6 provided by this section for performing the duties required of them by the Constitution and
7 the laws of this State. They shall be reimbursed for expenses as provided by law.

8 (a–1) The government of each county shall furnish an office for the sheriff and pay
9 the necessary expenses for telephones, stationery and for other purposes, and unless
10 otherwise provided by law, shall provide for the necessary traveling expenses of the sheriff
11 for conveying prisoners to any penal institution in the State and other necessary traveling
12 expenses.

13 (d) (1) (i) In Baltimore City, the Sheriff shall receive an expense allowance
14 of \$750 two times per year and a salary of:

15 1. \$79,300 in calendar year 2007;

16 2. \$84,600 in calendar year 2008;

17 3. \$89,900 in calendar year 2009;

18 4. \$95,200 in calendar year 2010; and

19 5. In calendar year 2011 and thereafter, no less than the
20 salary of a Command Staff 2 in the Baltimore City Police Department at the midpoint in
21 the pay scale.

22 (ii) The Sheriff:

23 1. Shall appoint an undersheriff or chief deputy sheriff, one
24 assistant sheriff, three deputy sheriff majors, three deputy sheriff captains, six deputy
25 sheriff lieutenants, one secretary sheriff, and one fiscal clerk sheriff; and

26 2. May appoint up to a maximum of:

27 A. 9 deputy sheriff sergeants;

28 B. 103 deputy sheriffs;

29 C. 2 domestic violence clerks; and

30 D. 2 domestic violence advocates.

1 (iii) 1. Except for deputy sheriffs, deputy sheriff sergeants, and
 2 deputy sheriff lieutenants, salaries for these employees shall be set by the Secretary of
 3 Budget and Management.

4 2. Salaries for deputy sheriffs shall be set at a rate not less
 5 than the salary equivalent to grade 14 of the State pay scale.

6 3. Salaries for deputy sheriff sergeants shall be set at a rate
 7 not less than the salary equivalent to grade 16 of the State pay scale.

8 4. Salaries for deputy sheriff lieutenants shall be set at a rate
 9 not less than the salary equivalent to grade 18 of the State pay scale.

10 **5. THE SHERIFF OF BALTIMORE CITY MAY CREATE A**
 11 **SHERIFF'S OFFICE PAY SCALE FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE,**
 12 **OTHER THAN THE SHERIFF, WHICH ~~MAY NOT~~:**

13 **A. ~~MEET~~ MAY MEET OR EXCEED THE SALARY**
 14 **EQUIVALENTS PROVIDED IN SUBSUBPARAGRAPHS 1 THROUGH 4 OF THIS**
 15 **SUBPARAGRAPH; ~~OR~~ BUT**

16 **B. ~~EXCEED~~ MAY NOT EXCEED THE SHERIFF'S TOTAL**
 17 **BUDGET AS PROVIDED BY THE ANNUAL ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES OF BALTIMORE**
 18 **CITY.**

19 (iv) **THE SHERIFF ~~SHALL~~ MAY APPOINT:**

20 **1. AN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SPECIALIST TO THE**
 21 **RANK OF CAPTAIN TO ASSESS AND MANAGE THE TECHNOLOGY NEEDS OF THE**
 22 **SHERIFF'S OFFICE;**

23 **2. A CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER TO THE RANK OF MAJOR**
 24 **TO MANAGE THE BUDGET OF THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE, GRANTS, AND THE REVENUE**
 25 **COLLECTED BY THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE; AND**

26 **3. A DEPUTY SHERIFF EMPLOYED BY THE SHERIFF'S**
 27 **OFFICE FOR 5 OR MORE YEARS TO THE HONORARY RANK OF DEPUTY SHERIFF**
 28 **CORPORAL WHO SHALL RECEIVE A \$1,000 INCREASE IN SALARY ANNUALLY IF THE**
 29 **PERSON MAINTAINS A SATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE EVALUATION FOR EACH**
 30 **RATING PERIOD.**

31 (v) In addition to any other compensation received, each deputy
 32 sheriff shall receive an expense allowance of ~~[\$400]~~ **\$600** annually for:

1 1. Ammunition for practice sessions at the range;

2 2. Clothing allowance to defray the cost of dry cleaning and
3 maintaining the clothing worn while on duty; and

4 3. The purchase and maintenance of other items necessary
5 to fulfill duties that currently are not furnished by the Baltimore City Sheriff's Department.

6 **(VI) SUBJECT TO THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR BALTIMORE CITY,**
7 **EACH DEPUTY SHERIFF MAY RECEIVE, IN ADDITION TO THE ALLOWANCE PROVIDED**
8 **UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (V) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, AN EXPENSE ALLOWANCE NOT**
9 **EXCEEDING \$200 ANNUALLY FOR THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (V)**
10 **OF THIS PARAGRAPH.**

11 ~~[(v)]~~ ~~(VI)~~ **(VII)** A deputy sheriff who uses a personal automobile is
12 entitled to a monthly automobile allowance at the same rate paid to other State employees.
13 Any Sheriff who is assigned a city-owned automobile may not receive the monthly
14 automobile expense allowance.

15 ~~[(vi)]~~ ~~(VII)~~ **(VIII)** The Sheriff's Office shall also have assistants at the
16 compensation provided for in the annual ordinance of estimates of Baltimore City.
17 Provisions shall also be made in the ordinance for the expenses of the Office of the Sheriff,
18 including the purchase and maintenance of motor vehicles.

19 ~~[(vii)]~~ ~~(VIII)~~ **(IX)** The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have the
20 same power with respect to the salaries of the Office of the Sheriff as they have under the
21 city charter with respect to the salaries of all municipal departments.

22 ~~[(viii)]~~ ~~(IX)~~ **(X)** Employees of the Sheriff's Office, except the Sheriff,
23 shall be selected according to the provisions of the State Personnel and Pensions Article.

24 (2) The Mayor and City Council shall pay monthly to the Sheriff of
25 Baltimore City one twelfth of the amount provided in the ordinance of estimates for the
26 expenses of the Sheriff's Office. Within 30 days after June 30th in each and every year the
27 Sheriff of Baltimore City shall pay to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore any of the
28 unexpended expense funds advanced during the preceding year and render a detailed
29 account to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore of all expense funds received and
30 expended by him. The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall reimburse the State of
31 Maryland for the administrative costs incurred because the employees of the Sheriff's Office
32 of Baltimore City are in the State Personnel Management System.

33 (3) During the course of his employment, any deputy sheriff of Baltimore
34 City may ride in Baltimore City on public transportation of the Maryland Transit
35 Administration without paying any fare if he shows proper identification regarding his
36 position as a deputy sheriff.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
2 October 1, 2017.
