## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

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State Board of Chiropractic and Massage Therapy Examiners and State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners – Dry Needling – Registration Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain licensed chiropractors and certain licensed physical 5 therapists from performing dry needling except under certain circumstances; 6 authorizing certain licensed chiropractors who have the right to practice physical 7 therapy and certain physical therapists to perform dry needling if certain health 8 occupations boards have registered the licenses in accordance with certain provisions 9 of law; requiring certain health occupations boards to register certain licensees who submit to the board a certain application, evidence of completion of certain education 10 11 and clinical experience requirements, and a certain application fee; requiring that 12 certain regulations be developed in collaboration with certain health occupations 13 boards, be at least as stringent as certain provisions of law, and require successful completion of certain courses; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the 14 15 State Board of Chiropractic and Massage Therapy Examiners, the State Board of 16 Physical Therapy Examiners, and registration requirements for dry needling.


SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 3 Article – Health Occupations

- 4 3–101.
- 5 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 6 (b) "Board" means the State Board of Chiropractic and Massage Therapy 7 Examiners.
- 8 (c) "Chiropractor" means an individual who practices chiropractic.
- 9 (D) (1) "DRY NEEDLING" MEANS THE INSERTION OF ONE OR MORE SOLID 10 NEEDLES INTO THE SKIN FOR A THERAPEUTIC PURPOSE WITHOUT INJECTING OR 11 WITHDRAWING ANY FLUIDS.
- 12 (2) "DRY NEEDLING" DOES NOT INCLUDE THE INSERTION OF ONE OR
  13 MORE SOLID NEEDLES INTO THE SKIN FOR PURPOSES OF DETOXIFICATION,
  14 SMOKING CESSATION, STRESS RELIEF, OR ANY OTHER PURPOSE THAT IS NOT
  15 WITHIN THE SCOPE OF PRACTICE OF A LICENSED CHIROPRACTOR WITH THE RIGHT
  16 TO PRACTICE PHYSICAL THERAPY.
- 17 **[**(d)**](E)** "License" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a license issued 18 by the Board:
- 19 (1) To practice chiropractic; or
- 20 (2) To practice chiropractic with the right to practice physical therapy.
- [(e)](F) "Licensed chiropractor" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a chiropractor who is licensed by the Board to practice chiropractic or to practice chiropractic with the right to practice physical therapy.
- [(f)](G) (1) "Practice chiropractic" means to use a drugless system of health care based on the principle that interference with the transmission of nerve impulses may cause disease.
- 27 (2) "Practice chiropractic" includes the diagnosing and locating of 28 misaligned or displaced vertebrae and, through the manual manipulation and adjustment 29 of the spine and other skeletal structures, treating disorders of the human body.
- 30 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this title, "practice chiropractic" does 31 not include the use of drugs or surgery, or the practice of osteopathy, obstetrics, or any 32 other branch of medicine.

- 1 (4) The definition of "practice chiropractic" does not prohibit a chiropractor 2 from selecting diet and hygiene measures for an individual.
- 3 [(g)](H) "Practice physical therapy" has the meaning stated in § 13–101 of this 4 article.

- 9 (I) OFFERED AT AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT 10 IS ACCREDITED BY AN ACCREDITING ORGANIZATION THAT THE BOARD RECOGNIZES 11 IN ITS REGULATIONS; AND
- 12 (II) APPROVED BY THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION 13 COMMISSION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
