(Senate Bill 589)

AN ACT concerning

University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus – Employees – Authorization to Fund-Raise

FOR the purpose of authorizing an employee of the University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus to solicit gifts or proposals for grants for the benefit of the University of Maryland Medical System Corporation in accordance with certain provisions of law and policies; and generally relating to University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus employees and fund-raising.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(j) ~~(1)~~ The Board of Directors will coordinate with University fund-raising efforts all Medical System Corporation campaigns and solicitations for private gifts and proposals for private or federal grants.

NOTWITHSTANDING §§ 5-505 AND 5-506 OF THE GENERAL PROVISIONS ARTICLE, AN EMPLOYEE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, BALTIMORE CAMPUS MAY SOLICIT GIFTS OR PROPOSALS FOR GRANTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND MEDICAL SYSTEM CORPORATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 13-303(J) OF THIS TITLE AND THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND'S MARYLAND, BALTIMORE CAMPUS'S POLICIES REGARDING COORDINATING FUND-RAISING BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY AND THE MEDICAL SYSTEM CORPORATION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
