## Washington County – Board of Education – Alternative Teacher Certification Program

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Washington County Board of Education to establish an 5 alternative teacher certification program; authorizing the Board to declare a critical 6 teacher shortage and certify certain candidates to fill certain teacher shortage 7 vacancies in certain areas during a certain time period; specifying who may fill a 8 certain vacant position during the school year; providing that a candidate hired to 9 fill a critical shortage teacher vacancy is not eligible for a certain certificate except under certain circumstances; and generally relating to an alternative teacher 10 11 certification program in Washington County.

- 1 (2) If a teacher hired to fill a critical teacher shortage 2 Vacancy completes a certification track approved by the Department 3 During the term of employment, the teacher may become eligible for an 4 Educator certificate issued by the State Superintendent under this 5 Subtitle.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 7 1, 2015.
