CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

Economic Development – Regional Advanced Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland

FOR the purpose of renaming the Regional Additive Manufacturing Partnership of 4 Maryland to be the Regional Advanced Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland: 5 6 renaming the Regional Additive Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland Fund to be 7 the Regional Advanced Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland Fund; expanding 8 the purposes of the Partnership; altering the number and composition of the voting 9 members of the Executive Board; requiring the Board to expand certain 10 apprenticeship opportunities; requiring the Partnership to submit certain 11 information to the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation; requiring the 12 Department of Commerce and the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation 13 to consider certain requests for financial support in their annual budget 14 recommendations; expanding the political subdivisions that may provide financial 15 support to the Partnership; altering the composition of the Fund; altering certain definitions; making conforming changes; and generally relating to the Regional 16 Advanced Manufacturing Partnership of Maryland. 17


