AN ACT concerning
Electronic Cigarettes – Sale to Minors – Components, Supplies, and Enforcement
FOR the purpose of clarifying that the prohibition against selling, distributing, or offering for sale a certain electronic device to a minor that can be used to deliver nicotine includes any component for the device or product used to refill or resupply the device; clarifying that the exception to the prohibition for devices approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration applies only to devices for sale as a certain tobacco cessation product; changing a violation of the prohibition from a misdemeanor to a civil infraction; ehanging a violation of the prohibition from a misdemeanor to a civil infraction; establishing certain civil penalties; providing that a sworn law enforcement officer, county health officer, or a designee of a county health officer may issue a certain civil citation for a violation of this Act; providing requirements for processing a certain citation; providing for a certain election to
