State Board of Education - Membership - Teachers and Parent

FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the State Board of Education to add a certain number of members who are certified teachers <u>with certain experience</u> and a parent of a certain student; authorizing the teacher members to be appointed to the State Board although the individuals are subject to the authority of the State Board; <u>prohibiting the two teacher members from being employed by the same county board of education;</u> requiring the Governor to appoint certain teacher members with the advice and consent of the Senate from a certain list certain lists jointly submitted to the Governor by the State Department of Education after an election by teachers in the State by certain organizations; requiring the Department to provide notice of a certain vacancy to certain individuals and organizations; <u>authorizing certain teacher members to attend and participate in certain sessions of the State Board; prohibiting a teacher member from voting on certain matters; requiring a certain election to be</u>
