- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program, subject to a 5 certain limitation, to provide coverage for hair prostheses to Program recipients 6 whose hair loss results from alopecia areata and prescription drugs and medical 7 devices approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for the treatment of 8 alopecia areata; requiring certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and 9 health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for a hair prosthesis for hair 10 loss resulting from alopecia areata; and generally relating to health insurance 11 carriers, the Maryland Medical Assistance Program, and coverage for the treatment 12 of alopecia areata.

.5	(c) To be covered under this section, a hair prosthesis must be prescribed by:
6	(1) the oncologist in attendance; OR
