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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Electric Companies – Generation Request for Proposals – Expansion of Area**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Service Commission to consider all areas of  
4 the State when determining the need for additional electricity generation;  
5 requiring an electric company to reference generation potential in all areas of  
6 the State in a request for proposals submitted to the Commission; specifying  
7 certain criteria that an electric company shall consider in a request for  
8 proposals; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to  
9 electricity generation.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Public Utilities**

18 **7–214.**

19 **(A) WHEN CONSIDERING THE NEED FOR NEW ELECTRIC GENERATION**  
20 **FACILITIES UNDER § 7–510(C)(6) OF THIS TITLE, THE COMMISSION SHALL**  
21 **INCLUDE ALL AREAS OF THE STATE IN THE SCOPE PROVISION OF A DRAFT**  
22 **REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS.**

23 **(B) (1) WHEN THE COMMISSION REQUIRES AN ELECTRIC COMPANY**  
24 **TO SUBMIT A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR NEW GENERATION FACILITIES, THE**

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EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 ELECTRIC COMPANY SHALL REFER TO GENERATION CAPACITY IN ALL AREAS OF  
2 THE STATE.

3 (2) AN ELECTRIC COMPANY SHALL CONSIDER GENERATION  
4 CAPACITY IN TERMS OF LOCATION, ECONOMIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS,  
5 AND OTHER APPROPRIATE FACTORS.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency  
7 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,  
8 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members  
9 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from  
10 the date it is enacted.
