11 ~~review and requiring the Administration to update the program guidance~~
12 document annually, to submit the annual review and update to the Department
13 ~~for review and comment, and to make the program and program updates~~
14 guidance document available to the public in a certain manner; manner;
15 ~~establishing certain standards and requirements for a road salt management~~
16 ~~program; authorizing the Administration, in consultation with the Department,~~
17 ~~to establish a road salt management program or to review and update the~~
18 ~~program for a local jurisdiction under certain circumstances~~ authorizing the
19 Administration to include certain information in the guidance document;
