1 AN ACT concerning

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Frederick County – Alcoholic Beverages – Consumption Permits

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a beer and wine consumption permit and a beer, wine, and liquor consumption permit in Frederick County; authorizing the Board of License 4 $\mathbf{5}$ Commissioners for Frederick County to issue the permits to certain holders of Class 6 A alcoholic beverages licenses; authorizing the holders to allow certain on-premises 7 consumption of alcohol; requiring an applicant for certain permits to submit a certain 8 application to the Board; authorizing the Board to issue certain permits under 9 certain circumstances; providing for the renewal of certain permits; providing for the 10 amount of a certain alcoholic beverage an individual may consume under certain 11 circumstances; establishing the scope of the permits; prohibiting a permit holder 12 from allowing an individual to carry an open container from the licensed premises; 13prohibiting a permit holder from serving a certain alcoholic beverage from a 14 drive-through window; establishing fees for the permits; and generally relating to 15alcoholic beverages in Frederick County.

18 (3) IF AN INITIAL PERMIT APPLICATION IS DENIED, THE APPLICANT
19 MAY REQUEST A PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE BOARD.

20 (4) RENEWAL OF THE PERMIT MAY BE MADE WHEN THE LICENSE 21 HOLDER'S CLASS A LICENSE IS RENEWED.

22 (E) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY CONSUME BEER, WINE, OR LIQUOR COVERED BY 23 THE PERMIT IN A QUANTITY NOT EXCEEDING:

- 24 (1) 12 TOTAL OUNCES OF BEER;
- 25 (2) 6 TOTAL OUNCES OF WINE; OR

26 (3) 0.5 TOTAL OUNCES OF LIQUOR, WHICH MAY BE MIXED WITH 27 OTHER NONALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.
