3 **EDUCATION OUTCOMES FOR TARGETED YOUTH;**

4 **(3) CREATE AN EQUAL MATCHING FUND FOR NONPROFIT**

28 **(A) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM, A NONPROFIT**
29 **ORGANIZATION SHALL:**

30 **(1) BE LOCATED IN THE STATE;**

1 (2) HAVE A CONTRACT OR MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH
2 A LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM OR AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION OR MUST
3 ESTABLISH ONE IF ONE DOES NOT EXIST; AND

4 (3) DEMONSTRATE AN EQUAL MATCH FOR FUNDS REQUESTED.

5 (B) A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT RECEIVES FUNDING THROUGH THE
6 PROGRAM SHALL:

7 (1) SUBMIT DATA ON OUTREACH PROGRAMS;

8 (2) TRACK STUDENT PROGRESS THROUGH THE HIGHER EDUCATION
9 SYSTEM; AND

10 (3) SUBMIT ANNUAL REPORTS TO THE COMMISSION ON OR BEFORE
11 OCTOBER 1 FOLLOWING THE FISCAL YEAR IN WHICH FUNDS WERE RECEIVED.

13 (A) THE COMMISSION SHALL PREPARE A REPORT ON THE PROGRAM THAT
14 INCLUDES:

15 (1) A SUMMARY OF THE REPORTS RECEIVED REGARDING THE
16 PROGRAM;

17 (2) THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS DISTRIBUTED EACH FISCAL YEAR; AND

18 (3) IF AN ELIGIBLE WAIT LIST EXISTS, THE NUMBER OF NONPROFIT
19 ORGANIZATIONS ON THE WAIT LIST.

20 (B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2017, AND DECEMBER 1, 2018, THE
21 COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A COPY OF THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER
22 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE
23 WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

29 October 1, 2015. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of September

1 30, 2019, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
2 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
