1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Interagency Disabilities Board – Membership and Duties – Community**
3 **Inclusion Training Oversight**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Interagency Disabilities Board;
5 requiring the Board to review the content and monitor the implementation of the
6 training objectives and curriculum adopted by the Police Training Commission for a
7 community inclusion training program at least once in a certain time period or more
8 frequently if requested by the Commission; and generally relating to the membership
9 and duties of the Interagency Disabilities Board.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 The Board shall:

3 (1) provide ongoing examination of the structure and organization of the
4 State's system of services and support to individuals with disabilities to ensure equal access
5 to support services and resources by individuals with disabilities;

6 (2) facilitate the development of performance objectives that will result in
7 a comprehensive, effective, efficient, and integrated service delivery system for individuals
8 with disabilities;

9 (3) develop an interagency funding approach to maximize efficiencies and
10 streamline access to services and support for individuals with disabilities;

11 (4) formulate policies on legislative issues and, under the direction of the
12 Governor, communicate the policies to the General Assembly; [and]

13 (5) develop the State Disabilities Plan; AND

14 (6) REVIEW THE CONTENT AND MONITOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF
15 THE TRAINING OBJECTIVES AND CURRICULUM ADOPTED BY THE POLICE TRAINING
16 COMMISSION FOR A COMMUNITY INCLUSION TRAINING PROGRAM:

17 (I) AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 4 YEARS; OR

18 (II) MORE FREQUENTLY IF REQUESTED BY THE POLICE
19 TRAINING COMMISSION.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21 October 1, 2015.
