SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 3 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 4 (2) "Applicant" means an applicant for employment.
- 5 (3) (i) "Electronic communications device" means any device that uses 6 electronic signals to create, transmit, and receive information.
- 7 (ii) "Electronic communications device" includes computers, 8 telephones, personal digital assistants, and other similar devices.
- 9 (4) (i) "Employer" means:
- 12 2. a unit of State or local government.
- 13 (ii) "Employer" includes an agent, a representative, and a designee 14 of the employer.
- 15 (III) "EMPLOYER" DOES NOT INCLUDE A LAW ENFORCEMENT
 16 AGENCY AS DEFINED IN § 3–201 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE.
- 17 <u>(5) "Law enforcement agency" has the meaning stated in §</u> 18 3–201 of the Public Safety Article.
- 19 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, an employer may not 20 request or require that an employee or applicant disclose any user name, password, or other 21 means for accessing a personal account or service through an electronic communications 22 device.
- 23 (2) An employer may require an employee to disclose any user name, 24 password, or other means for accessing nonpersonal accounts or services that provide 25 access to the employer's internal computer or information systems.
- 26 (c) An employer may not:
- 27 (1) discharge, discipline, or otherwise penalize or threaten to discharge, 28 discipline, or otherwise penalize an employee for an employee's refusal to disclose any 29 information specified in subsection (b)(1) of this section; or
- 30 (2) fail or refuse to hire any applicant as a result of the applicant's refusal to disclose any information specified in subsection (b)(1) of this section.

- 1 (d) An employee may not download unauthorized employer proprietary 2 information or financial data to an employee's personal Web site, an Internet Web site, a 3 Web-based account, or a similar account.
 - (e) This section does not prevent an employer:

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- 5 (1) based on the receipt of information about the use of a personal Web site, 6 Internet Web site, Web-based account, or similar account by an employee for business 7 purposes, from conducting an investigation for the purpose of ensuring compliance with 8 applicable securities or financial law, or regulatory requirements; or
- 9 (2) based on the receipt of information about the unauthorized 10 downloading of an employer's proprietary information or financial data to a personal Web 11 site, Internet Web site, Web-based account, or similar account by an employee, from 12 investigating an employee's actions under subsection (d) of this section.
- 13 (F) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A LAW
 14 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY MAY, DURING THE COURSE OF A BACKGROUND CHECK,
 15 REQUIRE AN APPLICANT TO OPEN ALL OF THE APPLICANT'S SOCIAL MEDIA
 16 ACCOUNTS FOR REVIEW BY AN INVESTIGATOR.
- 17 (2) (I) DURING A REVIEW OF THE APPLICANT'S SOCIAL MEDIA 18 ACCOUNTS, THE APPLICANT SHALL BE PRESENT.
- 19 (II) AN INVESTIGATOR MAY PRINT SELECTIONS FROM THE
 20 APPLICANT'S SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNTS ONLY IF THE SELECTIONS TO BE PRINTED
 21 DO NOT CONTAIN A USER NAME, PASSWORD, OR OTHER MEANS FOR ACCESSING A
 22 PERSONAL ACCOUNT OR SERVICE.
- 23 <u>(III) THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY MAY NOT:</u>
- 24 <u>1. KEEP OR RESERVE THE APPLICANT'S USER NAME,</u> 25 PASSWORD, OR OTHER MEANS FOR ACCESSING A PERSONAL ACCOUNT OR SERVICE 26 THROUGH AN ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS DEVICE; AND
- 27 <u>PROHIBIT AN APPLICANT FROM CHANGING A USER</u>
 28 <u>NAME, PASSWORD, OR OTHER MEANS FOR ACCESSING A PERSONAL ACCOUNT OR</u>
 29 SERVICE.
- 30 (f) (G) (1) Whenever the Commissioner determines that this section has 31 been violated, the Commissioner shall:
- 32 (i) try to resolve any issue involved in the violation informally by 33 mediation; or

8 9 10 11	(d) (1) "Law enforcement agency" means a governmental police force, sheriff's office, or security force or law enforcement organization of the State, a county, or a municipal corporation that by statute, ordinance, or common law is authorized to enforce the general criminal laws of the State.
12 13	(2) "Law enforcement agency" does not include members of the Maryland National Guard who:
14 15	(i) are under the control and jurisdiction of the Military Department;
16 17	(ii) are assigned to the military property designated as the Martin State Airport; and
18 19	(iii) are charged with exercising police powers in and for the Martin State Airport.
