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## Housing and Community Development – Neighborhood Revitalization – Passive House Pilot Program

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Passive House Pilot Program in the Department of 5 Housing and Community Development; establishing the purposes of the Program; 6 requiring the Department to solicit proposals from nonprofit organizations that 7 feature certain elements; requiring the Department to give priority to proposals for 8 which a nonprofit organization partners with certain educational institutions; 9 establishing the Passive House Pilot Program Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the Secretary of Housing and 10 11 Community Development or the Secretary's designee to administer the Fund; 12 requiring the State Treasurer to hold the Fund and the Comptroller to account for 13 the Fund; specifying the contents of the Fund; requiring the Governor, for certain 14 fiscal years, to include a certain appropriation in the annual budget bill for the Fund; 15 providing for the investment of money in and expenditures from the Fund; requiring 16 interest earnings of the Fund to be credited to the Fund; providing that certain 17 appropriations and expenditures are subject to audit by the Office of Legislative 18 Audits: exempting the Fund from a certain provision of law requiring interest 19 earnings on State money to accrue to the General Fund of the State; requiring the 20 Department to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; providing for the 21 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Passive House Pilot Program.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of September 30, 2024, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
