African American Heritage Preservation Grant Fund - Alterations

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the uses of the African American Heritage Preservation Grant 4 Fund to include grants to an African American heritage organization for a certain 5 purpose; providing that the Grant Fund shall be jointly administered by the 6 Commission on African American History and Culture and the Maryland Historical 7 Trust; allocating certain money in the Grant Fund to be used for certain purposes; 8 altering the required contents of a certain application for a certain grant; granting 9 to the Commission the sole authority to award a grant from the Grant Fund to an African American heritage organization for a certain purpose; and generally relating 10 11 to the African American Heritage Preservation Grant Fund.



1 In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) 2 "Trust" means the Maryland Historical Trust. (m) 3 5A - 330. 4 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. (2)"AAHP Grant Fund" means the African American Heritage 5 6 Preservation Grant Fund of the **COMMISSION AND THE** Trust. 7 "African American Heritage Grant" means a grant made: (3)8 **(I)** under the Program; OR 9 TO AN AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE ORGANIZATION TO (II)10 FUND THE ORGANIZATION'S OPERATIONS AND ACTIVITIES. 11 **(4)** "African American Heritage Preservation Project" means a capital 12 project that: 13 preserves buildings, communities, and sites of historical and (i) 14 cultural importance to the African American experience in the State; and 15 (ii) is for: the acquisition of land or buildings; or 16 1. 17 2. the construction or improvement of land or buildings. 18 "Commission" means the Commission on African American History and (5)19 Culture. 20 "Construction or improvement" means planning, design, engineering, (6)21alteration, construction, reconstruction, enlargement, expansion, extension, improvement, 22replacement, rehabilitation, renovation, upgrading, repair, or capital equipping. 23(7)"Program" means the African American Heritage Preservation 24Program. "Secretary" means the Secretary of Planning. 25(8)26 (b) (1) There is an African American Heritage Preservation Program in the 27 Trust.

1 The purpose of the Program is to identify and preserve buildings, (2) 2 communities, and sites of historical and cultural importance to the African American 3 experience in the State. 4 The Trust shall develop and administer the Program in partnership with the Commission. 5 6 There is an African American Heritage Preservation Grant Fund in the (1) (c) 7 Trust. 8 The COMMISSION AND THE Trust shall JOINTLY administer the (2)9 AAHP Grant Fund. 10 The AAHP Grant Fund may be used only for African American (3)**(I)** 11 Heritage Grants. 12 (II)UP TO 30% OF THE MONEY IN THE AAHP GRANT FUND IN ANY YEAR MAY BE ALLOCATED FOR GRANTS TO AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE 13 ORGANIZATIONS TO FUND THE ORGANIZATIONS' OPERATIONS AND ACTIVITIES. 14 15 **(4)** (i) The AAHP Grant Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to reversion under § 7–302 of this article. 16 The State Treasurer shall hold the AAHP Grant Fund separately 17 (ii) and the Comptroller shall account for the AAHP Grant Fund. 18 The AAHP Grant Fund consists of: 19 (5)20 (i) money appropriated in the State budget to the Program; 21 (ii) investment earnings of the AAHP Grant Fund; 22 (iii) any other money from any other source accepted for the benefit 23of the AAHP Grant Fund; and 24(iv) money received from the sale of State general obligation bonds. 25For each fiscal year, the Governor shall include in the annual operating 26 or capital budget an appropriation of \$5,000,000 to the AAHP Grant Fund. 27 The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the AAHP Grant (7)(i) 28Fund in the same manner as other State money. 29 Any investment earnings of the AAHP Grant Fund shall be paid

into the AAHP Grant Fund.

1 (v) any other criteria determined by the Trust and the Commission 2 to be relevant. 3 (g) (1) In any fiscal year, the Secretary may reserve up to 20% of the money 4 available in the AAHP Grant Fund to award African American Heritage Grants to eligible 5 emergency African American Heritage Preservation Projects not otherwise applied for in accordance with subsection (d) of this section. 6 7 (2)The application for an emergency grant shall include any information 8 required by the Trust. The Trust and the Commission shall: 9 (3)10 (i) review all applications for emergency grants; and 11 (ii) for each application for an emergency grant. make 12 recommendations to the Secretary on whether to award the grant. 13 (h) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO AN AFRICAN AMERICAN 14 HERITAGE GRANT FOR AN AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE PRESERVATION 15 PROJECT. **(2)** The Secretary shall: 16 17 (i) review each grant application submitted under subsection (d) or 18 (g) of this section and the recommendations of the Trust and the Commission; 19 (ii) consider: 20 the applications and recommendations under the criteria set forth in subsection (f)(2) of this section; and 2122if the grant was submitted under subsection (g) of this 23section, the nature of the emergency; and 24subject to paragraph [(2)] (3) of this subsection, make the final 25decision to award the grant or deny the application. 26 [(2)] **(3)** The Secretary may award a grant under the Program only for an 27African American Heritage Preservation Project. 28 (i) On or before December 31 of each year, the Trust and the Commission shall

report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly, on the financial status and the activities of the Program and the

AAHP Grant Fund for the prior fiscal year.

- 1 (j) (1) This subsection applies only to an African American 2 Heritage Grant for an African American Heritage Preservation 3 Project.
- 4 **(2)** Except as provided in paragraph [(3)] **(4)** of this subsection, the Trust shall require a grantee awarded an African American Heritage Grant to enter into an agreement to preserve and maintain the property for which the grant was awarded.
- 7 **[**(2)**] (3)** If the property is historic real property, the agreement shall be a 8 recordable historic preservation easement.
- 9 [(3)] (4) The Director may waive the agreement or easement requirement 10 if the Director determines that an agreement or easement is impracticable, infeasible, or 11 not necessary under the circumstances.
- 12 (k) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Secretary, in consultation with the Commission, shall adopt regulations to implement the Program.
- 14 (2) A proposed regulation that relates to approval by the Board of Public 15 Works of grants to be financed through the sale of State general obligation bonds may not 16 be adopted under paragraph (1) of this subsection unless the regulation is approved by the 17 Board of Public Works.
- (l) To the extent required by regulations adopted under subsection (k) of this section, the Trust and the Commission shall submit to the Board of Public Works for the Board's approval each African American Heritage Grant that is to be financed through the sale of State general obligation bonds.
