Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Department of Health and Human Services will require General Fund appropriations of \$2,651,080 in fiscal year 2023-24 and \$3,504,619 in fiscal year 2024-25 to provide recovery residence placements to individuals who were receiving services in correctional facilities and have been identified as no longer requiring medication-assisted treatment or alternative treatment, including weekly screening, and to establish one Comprehensive Health Planner II position.

The Department of Corrections will require General Fund appropriations of \$5,935,135 beginning in fiscal year 2024-25 for medical and other costs related to providing alternative treatments in correctional facilities for a person with substance use disorder, including alcohol use disorder.
