## An Act To Allow for Accurate Credit for a License Suspension for **Operating under the Influence**

### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2413, sub-§3, as repealed and replaced by PL 2005, c. 683,
Pt. B, §23, is amended to read:

4 3. Penalties. In addition to any other penalty, the court shall suspend the driver's license of a person convicted under subsection 1 for not less than 30 days nor more than 5 180 days, which minimum may not be suspended. In addition to any other penalty, the 6 court shall suspend the driver's license of a person convicted under subsection 1-A for not 7 less than 180 days nor more than 2 years, which minimum may not be suspended. If the 8 9 court fails to suspend the license, the Secretary of State shall impose the minimum period of suspension. The court shall impose a sentencing alternative that involves a fine of not 10 less than \$575, which may not be suspended. If a person's license is suspended under 11 section 2453 or 2453-A arising out of the same occurrence, the period of time the license 12 has been suspended under section 2453 or 2453-A prior to conviction must be deducted 13 14 from the period of suspension under this subsection.

#### SUMMARY

16 This bill provides that if the Secretary of State administratively suspends a person's 17 license for operating a motor vehicle with an excessive alcohol level or for operating a 18 motor vehicle under the influence of drugs, the amount of time the license was 19 administratively suspended must be deducted when suspending that person's license after 20 a conviction.
