SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4375

A bill to amend 1980 PA 300, entitled "The public school employees retirement act of 1979," by amending section 61 (MCL 38.1361), as amended by 2020 PA 267.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 61. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, if a retirant is receiving a retirement allowance other than a disability allowance payable under this act or under former 1945 PA 136, on account of either age or years of personal service performed, or both, and becomes employed by at a reporting unit, the following must occur: (a) The retirant is not entitled to a new final average

8 compensation or additional service credit under this retirement
9 system unless additional service is performed equivalent to 5 or





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more years of service credit or, if the retirant has contributed to 1 the member investment plan, the equivalent of 3 or more years of 2 service credit. The retirant may elect to have the retirement 3 allowance recomputed based on the added credit or the final average 4 5 compensation resulting from the added service, or both. A 6 retirement allowance must not be recomputed until the retirant pays 7 into the retirement system an amount equal to the retirant's new 8 final average compensation multiplied by the percentage determined 9 under section 41(2) for normal cost and unfunded actuarial accrued 10 liabilities, not including the percentage required for the funding 11 of health benefits, multiplied by the total service credit in the 12 period in which the retirant's additional service was performed. 13 (b) The retirant's retirement allowance must be reduced by the 14 lesser of the amount that the earnings in a calendar year exceed 15 the amount permitted without a reduction of benefits under the 16 social security act, chapter 531, 49 Stat 620, or 1/3 of the 17 retirant's final average compensation. For purposes of computing allowable earnings under this subdivision, the final average 18 19 compensation must be increased by 5% for each full year of 20 retirement.the retirant forfeits his or her retirement allowance 21 and the retirement system subsidy for health care benefits from the retirement system for the entire month of each month in which the 22 23 retirant is employed at the reporting unit. A retirant who has 24 forfeited the retirement system subsidy for health care benefits 25 under this subsection and who wants to retain health care benefits 26 shall pay the retirant's and retirement system's costs for the 27 health care benefits. The retirement allowance and retirement 28 system subsidy for health care benefits must resume without 29 recalculation on the first of the month following the month in



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which the retirant has terminated reporting unit employment.

2 (2) The retirement system may offset retirement benefits
3 payable under this act against amounts owed to the retirement
4 system by a retirant or retirement allowance beneficiary.

5 (3) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant who is
6 employed at a reporting unit if both of the following apply:

7 (a) The retirant retired after a bona fide termination of8 employment.

9 (b) The retirant is employed at any reporting unit on the 10 effective date of the amendatory act that added this subdivision.

11 (4) (3)—Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant if all of 12 the following circumstances exist:

13 (a) The retirant is a former teacher or administrator employed 14 in a teaching or research capacity who is employed by a university 15 that is considered a reporting unit for the limited purpose 16 described in section 7(3). A university that employs a retirant 17 under this subsection shall report that employment to the retirement system by July 1 of each year. The university shall 18 19 include in the report the name of the retirant, the capacity in 20 which the retirant is employed, and the total annual compensation 21 paid to the retirant. 22 (b) The retirant is not eligible to use any service or 23 compensation attributable to the employment described in

24 subdivision (a) for a recomputation of his or her retirement

25 allowance.

26 (4) Not later than April 1 of each year, the superintendent of

27 public instruction shall compile a listing of critical shortage

28 disciplines based on evidence of a shortage for each discipline.

29 The department of education shall post the listing and the



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accompanying evidence on its website. If a discipline is not 1 2 included in the listing of critical shortage disciplines, 2 or more contiguous reporting units may submit a written request to the 3 superintendent of public instruction to add a discipline to the 4 listing. The request must include evidence of a shortage of the 5 6 discipline in those contiguous reporting units. If the 7 superintendent of public instruction determines that there is a 8 shortage of the discipline in those contiguous reporting units, the 9 superintendent of public instruction shall add the discipline to 10 the listing. A discipline added under a request under this 11 subsection applies only to those contiguous reporting units. For 12 purposes of this subsection, a reporting unit that is a public school academy is considered contiguous to any other reporting unit 13 14 in which the public school academy is located. 15 (5) Until July 1, 2025, subsection (1) does not apply to a 16 retirant if all of the following circumstances exist: 17 (a) The retirant is employed by a reporting unit that has a 18 situation, not including a situation caused by a labor dispute, 19 that necessitates the hiring of the retirant in an area that has 20 been identified by the superintendent of public instruction as a 21 critical shortage discipline under subsection (4). 22 (b) The retirant is not eligible to use any service or 23 compensation attributable to the employment described in 24 subdivision (a) for a recomputation of his or her retirement 25 allowance. 26 (c) The reporting unit pays 100% of the contribution rates for 27 the unfunded actuarial accrued liability for retiree health care and the unfunded actuarial accrued liability for pension to the 28 29 retirement system for each retirant who becomes employed by a

9 (7) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act to the

10 contrary, for a retirant who retires after June 30, 2010, and following a bona fide termination, including not working in the 11 12 month of the retirant's retirement effective date, and who becomes employed by a reporting unit and the retirant's amount of earnings 13 14 in a calendar year exceeds 1/3 of the retirant's final average 15 compensation, the retirant forfeits his or her retirement allowance 16 and the retirement system subsidy for health care benefits from the 17 retirement system for the entire month of each month in which the 18 retirant is employed at the reporting unit unless the retirant is employed as described in subsection (5), (9), (10), (11), or (13). 19 20 A retirant who has forfeited the retirement system subsidy for 21 health care benefits under this subsection and who wants to retain health care benefits shall pay the retirant's and retirement 22 system's costs for the health care benefits. The retirement 23 24 allowance and retirement system subsidy for health care benefits 25 must resume without recalculation on the first of the month 26 following the month in which the retirant has terminated reporting 27 unit employment. (8) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act to the 28

29 contrary, for a retirant who retires after June 30, 2010, who



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performs core services at a reporting unit as determined by the 1 retirement system but who is employed by an entity other than the 2 3 reporting unit or is an independent contractor, the retirant forfeits his or her retirement allowance and the retirement system 4 5 subsidy for health care benefits from the retirement system for the 6 entire month of each month in which the retirant is performing core 7 services at the reporting unit, unless the retirant is employed as 8 described in subsection (9), (10), or (12). A retirant who has 9 forfeited the retirement system subsidy for health care benefits 10 under this subsection and who wants to retain health care benefits 11 shall pay the retirant's and retirement system's costs for the health care benefits. The retirement allowance and retirement 12 system subsidy for health care benefits must resume without 13 14 recalculation on the first of the month following the month in 15 which the retirant has terminated performing core services, as 16 described in this subsection. As used in this subsection, "core 17 services" does not include custodial, food, or transportation 18 services. 19 (9) Until July 1, 2025, subsection (1) does not apply to a 20 retirant who retires after June 30, 2010; who is employed as a 21 substitute teacher by a reporting unit, by an entity other than the 22 reporting unit, or as an independent contractor; who has been retired for at least 12 months before becoming employed under this 23 subsection unless, following a bona fide termination, including not 24 25 working in the month of the retirant's retirement effective date, 26 the retirant is employed at a reporting unit that provides 27 instruction under an extended COVID-19 learning plan under section 98a of the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1698a; 28 29 and whose amount of earnings attributable to employment by or at a



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reporting unit in a calendar year does not exceed 1/3 of his or her 1 final average compensation. A retirant described in this subsection 2 3 is not eligible to use any service or compensation attributable to the employment described in this subsection for a recomputation of 4 his or her retirement allowance. The reporting unit at which the 5 6 retirant provides substitute teacher services described in this 7 subsection shall pay 100% of the contribution rates for the 8 unfunded actuarial accrued liability for retiree health care and 9 the unfunded actuarial accrued liability for pension to the 10 retirement system for the employment described in this subsection. 11 The reporting unit shall report the engagement of substitute teachers to the retirement system at the same interval the 12 reporting unit reports information to the retirement system with 13 14 regard to its other employees. The reporting unit shall include in 15 the report the name of the substitute teacher and the total 16 earnings paid to the substitute teacher for that reporting period. 17 In order to comply with the reporting requirements of this 18 subsection, a reporting unit that engages substitute teachers 19 through an entity other than a reporting unit or as independent 20 contractors shall obtain from the substitute teacher's employer a 21 list of all substitute teachers the employer supplies to that reporting unit and the total earnings paid to each substitute 22 23 teacher for the reporting period. An employer other than a 24 reporting unit that employs substitute teachers as described in 25 this subsection shall provide to the reporting unit all information that the reporting unit is required to report to the retirement 26 27 system under this subsection. For the purposes of this subsection, 28 an employer includes an independent contractor. 29 (10) Until July 1, 2025, subsection (1) does not apply to a



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retirant who retires after June 30, 2010; who is employed as an 1 instructional coach or a school improvement facilitator by an 2 entity other than the reporting unit or as an independent 3 contractor; who has been retired for at least 12 months before 4 5 becoming employed under this subsection unless, following a bona 6 fide termination, including not working in the month of the 7 retirant's retirement effective date, the retirant is employed at a 8 reporting unit that provides instruction under an extended COVID-19 9 learning plan under section 98a of the state school aid act of 10 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1698a; and whose amount of earnings 11 attributable to employment at a reporting unit in a calendar year does not exceed 1/3 of his or her final average compensation. A 12 retirant described in this subsection is not eligible to use any 13 14 service or compensation attributable to the employment described in 15 this subsection for a recomputation of his or her retirement 16 allowance. The reporting unit at which the retirant provides the 17 services described in this subsection shall pay 100% of the 18 contribution rates for the unfunded actuarial accrued liability for 19 retiree health care and the unfunded actuarial accrued liability 20 for pension to the retirement system for the employment described in this subsection. The reporting unit shall report the engagement 21 22 of instructional coaches or school improvement facilitators to the 23 retirement system at the same interval the reporting unit reports 24 information to the retirement system with regard to its other 25 employees. The reporting unit shall include in the report the name of the instructional coach or school improvement facilitator and 26 the total earnings paid to the coach or facilitator for that 27 reporting period. In order to comply with the reporting 28 29 requirements of this subsection, a reporting unit shall obtain from



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the coach's or facilitator's employer a list of all instructional 1 coaches and school improvement facilitators the employer supplies 2 to that reporting unit and the total earnings paid to each coach or 3 facilitator for the reporting period. An employer other than a 4 5 reporting unit that employs instructional coaches or school 6 improvement facilitators as described in this subsection shall 7 provide to the reporting unit all information that the reporting 8 unit is required to report to the retirement system under this 9 subsection. For the purposes of this subsection, an employer 10 includes an independent contractor. As used in this subsection, "instructional coach" and "school improvement facilitator" mean 11 those terms as used in the listing of critical shortage disciplines 12 developed by the superintendent of public instruction under 13 14 subsection (4). 15 (11) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant who is a 16 former teacher or administrator who retires after June 30, 2010 and 17 before October 2, 2014, who following a bona fide termination, 18 including not working in the month of his or her retirement 19 effective date, becomes employed in a teaching or research capacity 20 or in a program-department direction capacity by a university that 21 is considered a reporting unit for the limited purpose described in section 7(3). A retirant described in this subsection is not 22 23 eligible to use any service or compensation attributable to the employment described in this subsection for recomputation of his or 24 25 her retirement allowance. The reporting unit at which the retirant provides the services described in this subsection shall pay 100% 26 27 of the contribution rates for the unfunded actuarial accrued liability for retiree health care and the unfunded actuarial 28 29 accrued liability for pension to the retirement system for the



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employment described in this subsection. The reporting unit shall 1 report the employment of a retirant as described in this subsection 2 to the retirement system by July 1 of each year. The reporting unit 3 shall include in the report the name of the retirant, the capacity 4 in which the retirant is employed, and the total annual 5 compensation paid to the retirant. 6 7 (12) Until July 1, 2025, notwithstanding any provision of this 8 act to the contrary, for a retirant who retires after June 30, 9 2010, who is employed as an independent contractor at a reporting 10 unit for a situation described in subsection (5) (a) or is employed 11 at a reporting unit for a situation described in subsection (5) (a) by an entity other than the reporting unit, and who has been 12 retired for at least 12 months before becoming employed under this 13 14 subsection unless, following a bona fide termination, including not 15 working in the month of the retirant's retirement effective date, 16 the retirant is employed at a reporting unit that provides 17 instruction under an extended COVID-19 learning plan under section 98a of the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1698a, 18 19 the reporting unit at which the retirant provides services under 20 this subsection shall pay 100% of the contribution rates for the 21 unfunded actuarial accrued liability for retiree health care and 22 the unfunded actuarial accrued liability for pension to the 23 retirement system for the employment described in this subsection. 24 (13) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant who retires after June 30, 2010 and before the ending date of funding for a 25 26 federal grant given from the United States Department of Education 27 in 2017, including any extensions, to fund the high-impact leadership for school renewal project and that meets the 28 29 requirements of subsection (14) and who, following a bona fide



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termination, becomes employed by a reporting unit as a school 1 2 renewal coach or high impact leadership facilitator as part of a school leadership support program that is funded by the federal 3 grant given from the United States Department of Education in 2017, 4 5 including any extensions, to fund the high-impact leadership for 6 school renewal project and that meets the requirements of 7 subsection (14). Also, subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant 8 who retires after June 30, 2010 and before the ending date of 9 funding for a federal grant that meets the requirements of 10 subsection (14) and who, following a bona fide termination, becomes 11 a national service member with a federally funded national service program such as Americorps State and National or Americorps VISTA 12 and is placed by the federally funded national service program at a 13 service site that is a reporting unit. A retirant described in this 14 15 subsection is not eligible to use any service or compensation 16 attributable to the employment described in this subsection for a recomputation of his or her retirement allowance. The reporting 17 unit shall pay 100% of the contribution rates for the unfunded 18 19 actuarial accrued liability for retiree health care and the 20 unfunded actuarial accrued liability for pension to the retirement system for the employment described in this subsection. The 21 reporting unit shall report the engagement of school renewal 22 coaches or high impact leadership facilitators to the retirement 23 system at the same interval the reporting unit reports information 24 to the retirement system with regard to its other employees. The 25 reporting unit shall include in the report the name of the school 26 renewal coach or high impact leadership facilitator and the total 27 earnings paid to the school renewal coach or high impact leadership 28 29 facilitator for that reporting period.



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(14) Subsection (13) applies to retirants employed as part of 1 2 a program that supports teams of school principals and teacher leaders in elementary schools by doing all of the following: 3 (a) Providing intense professional development and support, 4 and money, for renewal projects for teams of school leaders in a 5 6 number of project schools that are implementing a set of new 7 literacy essentials. 8 (b) Placing a trained team of school renewal coaches or high 9 impact leadership facilitators in each project school. 10 (c) Providing a lower level of professional development 11 support and funding for leaders in additional schools. 12 (d) Applying a set of proven school leadership practices for 13 school renewal and sustainable implementation. 14 (c) Providing training, support, and oversight for the school 15 renewal coaches or high impact leadership facilitators as a 16 coordinator or supervisor of that work. 17 (5) Subsection (1) does not apply to a retirant who is employed at a reporting unit if both of the following apply: 18 19 (a) The retirant retired after a bona fide termination of 20 employment. 21 (b) The retirant has been retired for at least 9 consecutive 22 months before becoming employed under this subsection. 23 (6) A retirant is not eligible to use any service or 24 compensation attributable to the employment described in 25 subsections (3), (4), or (5) for a recomputation of his or her 26 retirement allowance. 27 (7) For purposes of subsections (3), (4), and (5), the 28 retirement system shall determine, in accordance with federal law 29 that governs qualified retirement plans, whether a retirant retired



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1 after a bona fide termination of employment. If the retirement 2 system determines that a retirant did not retire after a bona fide 3 termination of employment, the retirement system may adjust the 4 retirant retirement allowance effective date following a bona fide 5 termination.

6 (8) A reporting unit shall report the employment of a retirant 7 as described in subsection (3) or (4), as applicable, to the 8 retirement system in a manner determined by the retirement system. 9 The reporting unit shall include in the report the name of the 10 retirant, the capacity in which the retirant is employed, and the 11 compensation paid to the retirant. An employer, other than a reporting unit, that employs retirants as described in subsection 12 13 (3) or (4) shall provide to the reporting unit all information that 14 the reporting unit is required to report to the retirement system 15 under this subsection.

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(9) As used in this section:

(a) "Bona fide termination of employment" means, as determined 17 18 by the retirement system under subsection (7), a retirant has 19 completely severed the employer-employee relationship with his or 20 her reporting unit employer. Completely severing the employer-21 employee relationship includes, but is not limited to, a retirant 22 not working for his or her reporting unit employer during the month 23 of the retirant's retirement allowance effective date and, before 24 the severing of the employer-employee relationship, the retirant 25 does not intend or expect or have an offer or contingency to become 26 employed at any reporting unit.

(b) "Employed at a reporting unit" means employed directly by
a reporting unit as an employee, indirectly by a reporting unit
through a contractual arrangement with other parties, or by



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- 1 engagement of a retirant by a reporting unit as an independent
- 2 contractor.



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
