THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 6. (1) A public body that is a city, village, township, 2 county, or state department, or under the control of a city, village, township, county, or state department, shall designate an 3 individual as the public body's FOIA coordinator. The FOIA 4 coordinator shall be responsible for accepting and processing 5 accept and process requests for the public body's public records 6 7 under this act and shall be responsible for approving a approve any denial under section 5(4) and (5). 5(5) and (6). In a county not 8 having an executive form of government, the chairperson of the 9

county board of commissioners is designated the FOIA coordinator
 for that county.

3 (2) For all other public bodies, the chief administrative
4 officer of the respective public body is designated the public
5 body's FOIA coordinator.

6 (3) An A FOIA coordinator may designate another individual to
7 act on his or her behalf in accepting and processing requests for
8 the public body's public records, and in approving a denial under
9 section 5(4) and (5).5(5) and (6).

(4) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5), a public
body shall conspicuously post in a public area of its premises at
least 1 printed notice containing all of the following information
on a sign that is at least 8-1/2 by 11 inches in size:

14 (a) Contact information for the public body's FOIA
15 coordinator, including his or her name and business telephone
16 number, email address, and mailing address.

(b) The same contact information described in subdivision (a)
for an individual designated to act on behalf of the public body's
FOIA coordinator under subsection (3), if a designation has been
made pursuant to subsection (3).

(5) If a public body directly or indirectly maintains an official internet presence, it may, instead of posting the sign described in subsection (4), conspicuously post and maintain all of the information described in subsection (4) on the home page of its website that is fully accessible to the public.
