## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 328

A bill to require certain standards for smoke alarm and certain other devices; to prohibit certain conduct and prescribe civil sanctions; to authorize the promulgation of rules; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act may be cited as the "smoke alarm battery standard act".
- 3 Sec. 3. (1) Except as provided under subsection (4), beginning
- 4 18 months after the effective date of this act, a person shall not
- 5 distribute, sell, offer for sale, or import a smoke alarm device
- 6 that fails to meet the battery and power source standards under
- 7 subsection (3).



- (2) A person that violates subsection (1) is responsible for a
   state civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of
   not more than \$500.00.
- 4 (3) Except as provided under subsection (4), beginning 18
  5 months after the effective date of this act, a smoke alarm device
  6 that is distributed, sold, offered for sale, or imported must not
  7 be powered by a replaceable and removable battery. The smoke alarm
  8 device must be powered for not less than 10 years by 1 of the
  9 following:
- 10 (a) A nonremovable and nonreplaceable battery.
- 11 (b) Another power source that utilizes new technology.
- 12 (4) The battery and power source standards under subsection
- 13 (3) do not apply to any of the following devices:
- 14 (a) A fire alarm, smoke detector, or smoke alarm that receives 15 power from an electrical system of a building, or is electronically 16 connected as part of a centrally monitored or supervised alarm 17 system.
- (b) A fire alarm, smoke detector, or smoke alarm with an ancillary component that receives power from an electrical system of a building, or with an ancillary component that is electronically connected as part of a centrally monitored or supervised alarm system.
- (c) A fire alarm, smoke detector, or smoke alarm, or a fire
  alarm, smoke detector, or smoke alarm with an ancillary component,
  that uses 1 or more of the following:
  - (i) A low-power radio frequency wireless communication signal.
- (ii) Wi-Fi or other wireless local area networking capabilityto send and receive notifications to and from the internet.
  - (d) Any other smoke alarm device with equivalent

- characteristics to a device listed under subdivision (a), (b), or(c), as determined by rules promulgated under subsection (5).
- 3 (5) The department of licensing and regulatory affairs, in
  4 consultation with the state fire marshal, may promulgate rules
  5 under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL
  6 24.201 to 24.328, to implement subsection (4)(d).
- 7 (6) As used in this section, "person" means an individual,
  8 estate, business or nonprofit entity, public corporation,
  9 government or governmental subdivision, agency, or instrumentality,
  10 or other legal entity.
