| 1.8 | Subd. 9. Extended supply. (a) After a patient has completed an initial 30-day |
| 1.9 | supply of a prescription drug, and the patient returns to the pharmacy to obtain a refill, a |
| 1.10 | pharmacist may dispense up to a 90-day supply of that prescription drug to the patient |
| 1.11 | when the following requirements are met: |
| 1.12 | (1) the total quantity of dosage units dispensed by the pharmacist does not exceed |
| 1.13 | the total quantity of dosage units of the remaining refills authorized by the prescriber; and |
| 1.14 | (2) the pharmacist is exercising the pharmacist's professional judgment. |
| 1.15 | (b) The initial 30-day supply requirement in paragraph (a) is not required if the |
| 1.16 | prescription has previously been filled with a 90-day supply. |
