1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 326.02, subdivision 4b, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 4b. Certified Practice of licensed interior designer design. (a) For the
1.8	purposes Any person shall be deemed to be practicing licensed interior design within the
1.9	meaning of sections 326.02 to 326.15, "certified interior designer" means a person who is
1.10	certified under section 326.10, to use the title certified interior designer and who provides
1.11	services who holds out as being able to perform or does perform any professional service
1.12	in connection with the <u>planning or</u> design of <del>public</del> interior spaces, including preparation
1.13	of documents relative to non-load-bearing interior construction, space planning, finish
1.14	finishes, materials, and furnishings, or administration of construction for interior spaces
