- \$500,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$500,000 for fiscal year 2025 are appropriated from
 the general fund to the commissioner of agriculture for grants to organizations, Tribal
 nations, and individual farmers in Minnesota to increase the adoption of soil health practices
 and, if applicable, promote the Agriculture Water Quality Certification Program by, at a
 minimum:
- 2.9 (1) holding field days with farmers, speakers, and educational events;
- 2.10 (2) developing farmer-to-farmer regional soil health hubs; and
- (3) working with technical assistance providers, including but not limited to Soil and
 Water Conservation Districts and the Minnesota Office of Soil Health to provide soil health
 adoption and climate resiliency programming for farmers.
