1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2015 Supplement, section 245A.175, is amended to read:

1.9	Subdivision 1. Training. (a) Prior to a nonemergency placement of a child in a
1.10	foster care home, the child foster care license holder and caregivers in foster family and
1.11	treatment foster care settings, and all staff providing care in foster residence settings
1.12	must: (1) complete two hours of training that addresses the causes, symptoms, and key
1.13	warning signs of mental health disorders; and (2) complete at least one hour of training
1.14	that addresses fetal alcohol spectrum disorders.
1.15	(b) Mental health and fetal alcohol spectrum disorders training must include cultural
1.16	considerations; and effective approaches for dealing with a child's behaviors.
