1.8	Subd. 8. Quick clearance. (a) Within the Department of Transportation's
1.9	eight-county metropolitan district, the Department of Transportation, in cooperation with
1.10	the State Patrol and private towing or recovery companies authorized by the state, may
1.11	move, remove, or cause to remove vehicles, debris, personal property, and cargo that
1.12	block or aggravate an emergency on the roadway, interstate highway, parkway, on-ramp,
1.13	or off-ramp following a collision, accident, or spilled load.
1.14	(b) Notwithstanding subdivision 7, any state or local law enforcement officer,
1.15	Department of Transportation employee, or person or firm acting as directed by the State
1.16	Patrol who contracts or assists in removing or disposing the vehicle, cargo, or other
