2.5 (d) The commissioner must adopt rules requiring driver's education programs offered
 2.6 at public schools, private schools, and commercial driver training schools to include
 2.7 instruction on how to safely interact with law enforcement officials during traffic stops and
 2.8 how drivers should safely respond to emergency situations related to operation of a vehicle.

2.9 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective June 1, 2019.

2.10 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 171.0705, is amended by adding a subdivision
 2.11 to read:

2.12 Subd. 11. **Driver's manual; safe police contacts.** The commissioner must include in
 2.13 each subsequent edition of the driver's manual published by the department a chapter on
 2.14 how to safely interact with law enforcement officials during traffic stops and how drivers
 2.15 should safely respond to emergency situations related to operation of a vehicle.

2.16 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective June 1, 2019.

2.17 Sec. 3. **DRIVER'S EDUCATION CONTENT TASK FORCE.**

2.18 Subdivision 1. **Task force establishment; duties; report.** (a) A Driver's Education
 2.19 Content Task Force is established to consider adding content to driver's education curriculum
 2.20 and to the driver's manual on how to safely interact with law enforcement officials during
 2.21 traffic stops and how drivers should safely respond to emergency situations related to
 2.22 operation of a vehicle. The task force must:

2.23 (1) make recommendations on how to implement these changes;

2.24 (2) propose content for addition to both driver's education curriculum and the driver's
 2.25 manual; and

2.26 (3) propose any legislation necessary to implement these changes.

2.27 (b) By February 15, 2019, the task force must submit a report to the chairs, ranking
 2.28 minority members, and staff of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over transportation
 2.29 policy and finance. The report must include the recommendations, proposed content, and
 2.30 proposed legislation developed under paragraph (a).

2.31 Subd. 2. **Members.** The task force consists of the following members:

3.1 (1) two senators, including one senator appointed by the senate majority leader and one
3.2 senator appointed by the senate minority leader;

3.3 (2) two members of the house of representatives, including one member appointed by
3.4 the speaker of the house and one member appointed by the minority leader;

3.5 (3) the commissioner of public safety or the commissioner's designee;

3.6 (4) the chief of the State Patrol or the chief's designee;

3.7 (5) one member appointed by the Sheriffs' Association;

3.8 (6) one member appointed by the Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association;

3.9 (7) one member appointed by the Minnesota Police and Peace Officers Association;

3.10 (8) one member appointed by the American Civil Liberties Union of Minnesota;

3.11 (9) one member appointed by the Peace Officer Standards and Training Board;

3.12 (10) one member appointed by the NAACP;

3.13 (11) one member representing the councils of color, appointed by the director of the
3.14 Legislative Coordinating Commission;

3.15 (12) one member representing driving schools, appointed by the commissioner of public
3.16 safety;

3.17 (13) one member appointed by the Minneapolis Urban League; and

3.18 (14) one community member representing community concerns, appointed by the
3.19 governor.

3.20 Subd. 3. **Administration.** (a) Each appointing entity under subdivision 2 must make
3.21 appointments by July 1, 2018.

3.22 (b) The commissioner of public safety must convene the initial meeting of the task force
3.23 no later than August 1, 2018. At the initial meeting, the members of the task force must
3.24 elect a chair or cochairs from among the task force members.

3.25 (c) The Legislative Coordinating Commission must provide meeting space, administrative
3.26 support, and staff support for the task force.

3.27 (d) Members of the task force serve without compensation or payment of expenses.

3.28 Subd. 4. **Expiration.** The task force under this section expires February 15, 2019, or the
3.29 day after the report required under subdivision 1, paragraph (b), is submitted, whichever is
3.30 earlier.

4.1 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.

4.2 Sec. 4. **CONSULTATION.**

4.3 The commissioner must consider the task force report submitted under section 3 (1) as
4.4 a comment submitted in response to the request for comments for the rulemaking under
4.5 Minnesota Statutes, section 171.0701, subdivision 1, authorized under section 1, and (2)
4.6 during the next driver's manual revision under Minnesota Statutes, section 171.0705,
4.7 subdivision 11.

4.8 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective June 1, 2019.

4.9 Sec. 5. **APPROPRIATION.**

4.10 \$..... in fiscal year 2019 is appropriated from the general fund to the Legislative
4.11 Coordinating Commission to pay expenses, including expenses of administrative and staff
4.12 support, related to the task force described under section 3.

4.13 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
