1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 171.05, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 2. Person less than 18 years of age. (a) Notwithstanding any provision
1.8	in subdivision 1 to the contrary, the department may issue an instruction permit to an
1.9	applicant who is 15, 16, or 17 years of age and who:
1.10	(1) has completed a course of driver education in another state, has a previously
1.11	issued valid license from another state, or is enrolled in either:
1.12	(i) the applicant has completed:
1.13	(A) the classroom phase of instruction in a public, private, or commercial driver
1.14	education program that is approved by the commissioner of public safety and that include
1.15	elassroom and behind-the-wheel training; or;
1.16	(ii) an approved behind-the-wheel driver education program (B) home-classroom
