1.14	(b) The MacPhail Center must use the grants received under paragraph (a) to broaden
1.15	access to music education in Minnesota. The program must supplement and enhance an

1.17	group activities, workshops, and early childhood music activities. The MacPhail Center
1.18	must design its program in consultation with music educators who teach at schools designated
