- 3.21 (e) "Tentative minimum tax" equals 6.75 percent of alternative minimum taxable income after subtracting the exemption amount determined under subdivision 3.
- 3.23 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective for taxable years beginning after December 3.24 31, 2016.
