1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 169.18, subdivision 12, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 12. Passing certain parked vehicles. (a) When approaching and before passing
1.9	a freeway service patrol vehicle, road maintenance vehicle, utility company vehicle, or
1.10	eonstruction service vehicle with its warning lights activated that is parked or otherwise
1.11	stopped on or next to a street or highway having two lanes in the same direction, the driver
1.12	of a vehicle shall safely move the vehicle to the lane farthest away from the parked or
1.13	stopped vehicle, if it is possible to do so.
1.14	(b) When approaching and before passing a freeway service patrol vehicle, road
1.15	maintenance vehicle, utility company vehicle, or construction service vehicle with its warning
1.16	lights activated that is parked or otherwise stopped on or next to a street or highway having
1.17	more than two lanes in the same direction, the driver of a vehicle shall safely move the
1.18	vehicle so as to leave a full lane vacant between the driver and any lane in which the vehicle
1.19	is completely or partially parked or otherwise stopped, if it is possible to do so.
1.20	(c) If a lane change under paragraph (a) or (b) is impossible, or when approaching and
1.21	before passing a freeway service patrol vehicle, road maintenance vehicle, utility company
1.22	vehicle, or construction service vehicle with its warning lights activated that is parked or
1.23	otherwise stopped on or next to a street or highway having only one lane in the same

direction, the driver of a vehicle must reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a speed that
is reasonable and prudent under the conditions until the motor vehicle has completely passed
the parked or stopped freeway service patrol vehicle, road maintenance vehicle, utility
company vehicle, or construction service vehicle, if it is possible to do so.

- 2.5 (d) For purposes of this subdivision, a "service vehicle" means a freeway service patrol
- 2.6 vehicle, road maintenance vehicle, utility company vehicle, construction vehicle, solid waste
- 2.7 <u>truck, recycling truck, or other similar vehicle or truck that stops on a roadway as part of</u>
- 2.8 providing service. A service vehicle must be equipped with warning lights.

2.9 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 169.64, subdivision 9, is amended to read:

Subd. 9. Warning lamp on vehicles collecting solid waste or recycling. A vehicle
used to collect solid waste or recycling may be equipped with a single amber gaseous
discharge warning lamp that meets the Society of Automotive Engineers standard J 1318,
Class 2. The lamp may be operated only when the collection vehicle is in the process of
collecting solid waste or recycling and is either:
(1) stopped at an establishment where solid waste or recycling is to be collected; or

- 2.15 (1) stopped at an establishment where solid waste <u>or recycling</u> is to be collected; or
- 2.16 (2) traveling at a speed that is at least ten miles per hour below the posted speed limit
- and moving between establishments where solid waste <u>or recycling</u> is to be collected.
