OFFICIAL STATUS

1.1 A bill for an act  
1.2 relating to public safety; providing that the sale or possession of cannabidiol is not  
1.3 a crime; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 152.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. **[152.185] POSSESSION OR SALE OF CANNABIDIOL.**

1.6 (a) Cannabidiol (CBD) that is derived from industrial hemp as defined in section 18K.02,  
1.7 subdivision 3, is not a controlled substance.

1.8 (b) A person does not violate this chapter simply by possessing or selling CBD as  
1.9 described in paragraph (a).

1.10 (c) Paragraph (b) does not prevent a person from being charged with or convicted of a  
1.11 violation of this chapter or any other crime if the person's conduct is criminalized elsewhere.

1.12 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective August 1, 2019, and applies to acts  
1.13 committed on or after that date.
