BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 3.737, is amended by adding a subdivision 1.6 to read: 1.7 Subd. 6. Grants; wolf-livestock conflict prevention. (a) The commissioner 1.8 may award grants to livestock producers to prevent wolf-livestock conflicts.
