1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 326B.821, subdivision 21, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 21. Residential building contractor, remodeler, and roofer education. (a) Each
1.8	licensee must, during each continuing education reporting period, complete and report one
1.9	hour of continuing education relating to energy codes or energy conservation measures
1.10	applicable to residential buildings and one hour of financial management strategies applicable
1.11	to residential construction businesses.
1.12	(b) Immediately following the adoption date of a new residential code, the commissioner
1.13	may prescribe that up to seven of the required 14 hours of continuing education credit per
1.14	licensure period include education hours specifically designated to instruct licensees on
1.15	new or existing State Building Code provisions.
